TECH TALK

HASH ... HASH?

GEORGE REIM posed the question: "Where does the gen. hash come from?" He answered his question with; "The capacity between the (key-switch) springs and the buss". With his letter, he included a sample piece of a Schober keyboard showing the modification he had made to solve that "capacitance" problem. The modification consisted of #28 wire glued to the PC board next to each gold buss - behind the key-switch springs. He went on to explain; "The wires next to the springs form a capacity which leads to ground - the path of least resistance. When the spring touches the buss, this becomes the (new) least resistance (path)".

LEE SUNDSTROM WRITES

Lee, in a recent letter, furnished a sketch showing how easy it is to install his VOX MODULATOR in a Schober organ. He also wrote; "Putting one of my Bucket Brigade Tremolos on a Schober involves lifting the output resistor of each Tibia filter from the filter output bus and running them to a bus that goes to the input of the B.B. Brigade Tremolo and then feeding the output of the trem. back into the audio bus or separate amplifier or whatever." The last sentence of his letter said; "I am sure that any owner of a Schober who would put both the Vox Mod and a B.B. for the Tibia would have a much better sounding organ."
