A HINT FROM ALLAN KIISK

I did some work on the organ -- and almost like a miracle -- it came back to good health again. I was ready to replace some electrolytic capacitors, but after turning the organ on, leaving it on for a while, turning it off again, and on again, the capacitors all came back to life. So the old organ is functioning like it used to many years ago,.

You may pass this information on to others, that one should not get panicky if after a long period of non-use, the organ does not function properly. Turn it off again, a few minutes later turn it on again, leave it on for a while, turn it off again. At that point, when you turn it on again, things should be back to normal -- if the original problem was caused by the electrolytic capacitors. I think the organ would be of good use to a student who needs to practice playing with full AGO pedals and several keyboards, with couplings and all, for becoming a church organist. I'll look around our area for such a need.
